


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TUTORS

ARAAKI THE FIRST DOG

Set in the forests of the prehistoric world 15,000 years ago, "Araaki" is an epic adventure that explores the origins of our bond with animals.

Alik (II) lives a lonely life in a tribe ruled by fear under Chief Grind (50) and his even crueler son, Mrapi (I3). One day, she discovers a wounded wolf pup in the woods. Defying the tribe's taboo, she takes her in to save her life.

When Grind discovers Alik's secret, they are cast out from the village. Together, they must face deadly predators, unknown landscapes, and, most of all, their own mistrust. As their bond deepens, their connection evolves into a transformative partnership—the first between a human and a dog. Alik names her Araaki.

Meanwhile, in the tribe, tyranny worsens as Mrapi fights for power against Grind. Alik decides to return with Araaki as a force of change. They rally the oppressed to rise and reclaim their freedom. Alik becomes a respected member of the tribe, and Araaki gives birth to six pups—promising more trouble and adventures in "Araaki 2"!

A visually stunning and emotionally powerful story, "Araaki" explores the timeless themes of bravery, loyalty, and the birth of a friendship that shaped history.

THE INCREDIBLE YOUNG DETECTIVES AND A CURIOUS CASE OF A WOUNDED TABLE

A group of twelve-year-old detectives—Maja, Jagoda, and Karol—are hired by Fran (I4) to decipher a letter from his late Grandma, Ela. As they work to decode it, they realise it's the first of the clues leading to a lost Frida Kahlo painting. Their mission: find it.

On their journey, the kids must face Destiny, run for their lives through perilous underground passages, and reach the stars. But they must hurry: a mysterious Valentina pursues them, and Greg, Ela's former student, also seeks the painting. Maja discovers her mum knew about the painting's disappearance and suspects it may be related to her death.

They discover Valentina is after Greg, not them, and Fran works with him. The kids have unintentionally guided them toward the painting. The failure brings them closer together, prompting one last attempt to retrieve it. Maja learns her mum didn't know who stole the painting and comes to terms with the fact that her death was an accident.

The kids chase after Greg and Fran and recover the painting. Nobody believes a group of kids could have achieved this, but they don't care – being a detective isn't about seeking glory; it's about doing what's right.



Natalia Ossowska is a screenwriter whose accolades include winning Script Pro Competition prizes (2020, 2022), being a BBC International Radio Playwriting Competition finalist (2020) and the Big Break semifinalist (2017) and placing second in the 2022 "Wyobraź sobie" competition with a project currently in development with Aurum Film. Kaja is 12 years old and loves the sea. She lives in a big city, so for most of the year, she misses the beach, the wind, and the sound of the waves. Her favorite place on Earth is her grandparents' house, located right by the Baltic Sea.

Every year, she spends a week of vacation there. However, this year will be different. It's the first time she's coming after the death of her beloved grandmother, which makes her feel lost. Her grandfather's strange behavior leads Kaja to spend most of her time with a boy from the neighborhood, David.

During one of their swims in the sea, Kaja notices a mysterious splash and is convinced that something tried to attack her. Neither David nor her grandfather believes her, so she decides to uncover the mystery herself.

Her investigation leads her to an extraordinary discovery: her grandmother was not an ordinary person—she guarded the boundary between the human world and the magical creatures inhabiting the Baltic. Now that she's gone, no one is watching that boundary. With David's help, Kaja will fight to restore balance between the worlds and save the sea mermaid—Zielenica.

PATCHWORK VACATION

POLISH TITLE: PACHWORKOWE WAKACJE

Róża (I2), Kalina (IO), and Wierka (8) share one mom, Maria, but have three dads who avoid each other at all costs. When Maria, exhausted from parenting heads to Bologna, the girls force fathers into a trip to the Tatra Mountains. What could go wrong? Everything.

Jan – corporate perfectionist, Filip – athlete and eternal Casanova, and Hubert – sensitive artist, must find a way to get along and tackle the challenges of parenting. Róża, Kalina, and Wierka are anything but calm and thrive on competition. The girls turn the trip into a game, keeping a secret ranking to answer THE question: which dad is the best? Chaos is guaranteed – from graffiti and a visit to the police station to trampoline injuries, sugar overloads, fleeing from sheep, and getting lost during hiking. Every mistake means lost points, but bravery, absurdly funny mishaps, and unexpected moments of connection can earn them back.

In the mountains fathers let go of grudges, and the girls learn family is about being together and understanding, not points.

"Patchwork Vacation" is a heartwarming and humorous story that reminds us perfect families don't exist – but the memories we create together last a lifetime.

Is a half-sister anything less than a sister? As Wierka would say: who even came up with the stupid idea of "half"?



Julita Olszewska is a Polish screenwriter and one of the writers of the Netflix series "Infamia" (2023), which won four awards at the BNP Paribas Warsaw SerialCon, including Best Polish Series of 2024 and Best Screenplay. She also wrote the award-winning short film "Alicja i Żabka" (2020) and the psychological drama "W spirali" (2015). Her latest project, the comedy film "Klątwa," has been completed and is awaiting its premiere. Currently, she is developing a new premium drama series.

In 2023, she received a Special Mention from StoryLab.pro and Second Prize – a scholarship from the Starak Family Foundation – in the "Wyobraź Sobie" competition for her treatment "Greetings to Prison." In addition to screenwriting, she is a model and leads a philosophical discussion club, "Chaotic Thinkers," in Milanówek. She travels in a campervan and aspires to become a skater and surfer.
